## **NATURAL BRIDGE CAVERNS LISTED AS ONE OF ‘10 GREAT PLACES’ BY USA TODAY**

SAN ANTONIO, Texas — Natural Bridge Caverns has been named one of America’s “10 great places to get nature on film” in a recent article in USA Today.

As the only Texas location selected, Natural Bridge Caverns was listed along with Yellowstone National Park (Wyoming), the Adirondack Mountains (New York), Muir Woods National Monument (California) and Rocky Mountain National Park (Colorado).

The article, which gave brief descriptions of each location, said Natural Bridge Caverns “offer great subterranean landscape photographic possibilities with dramatic lighting and science-fiction effects already in place.”

Brad Wuest, president of Natural Bridge Caverns, said they are honored to be listed among such elite national parks and natural areas.

Other top “nature spots” listed in the article were Garden of the Gods (Shawnee National Forest, Illinois), Block Island Greenway (Rhode Island), Everglades National Park (Florida), the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area and Glacier National Park (Montana).

Natural Bridge Caverns is the largest cavern in Texas and attracts more than 250,000 visitors a year. It is located 13 miles north of San Antonio on Natural Bridge Caverns Road (FM 3009) eight miles west of IH-35.
